Early Spring Walk Sat., April 12, 10 a.m.

Cowan entrance, Central City Parkway, west of Wayne Road, north of Warren Road. Looped trail along Tonquish Creek. This is the last walk in this section before construction begins.

Early Wildflower Walk Sat., April 19, 10 a.m.

Koppernick entrance, west of Hix Road, south of Joy Road. Wildflowers, rookery activity and wildlife in silent forest.

Earth Day/Arbor Day Work Day Sat., April 26, 9 a.m.- 1 p.m.

Newburgh entrance, east of Newburgh Road, just north of Warren Road. This is likely to be a muddy walk on the floodplain with some slippery (ice or mud) up and downs.

Spring Walk Sat., May 10, 9 a.m.

Ellsworth entrance parking at Nankin Mill on Hines Drive, east of Ann Arbor Trail. We will take loop trail across the floodplain. Last walk in this section before construction begins.

Tonquish Creek Rescue Sat., May 24, 8:30 a.m. registration

Hix Park entrance, west of Hix Road, just north of Warren Road. Creek and land work. Wear old clothes. Tasks: trash removal, moving wood, and cutting invasive plants. Tools, gloves, snacks and drinks provide. This work is done in conjunction with Friends of the Rouge.

Summer Work Day Sat., June 21, 9 a.m.

Foxland section. Parking at Koppernick Road entrance, west of Hix Road, south of Joy Road. Cutting invasive plants degrading area. Loppers, gloves, snacks and drinks provided.

Hix Park Parking Lot

B ill Craig and Jack Smiley were invited to meet with Kyle Mulligan, Westland Parks Director, to discuss proposed changes to the parking lot at Hix Park. The city has a plan to close off the current parking lot, with a gate. A new parking lot would be constructed along the south side of entrance drive. The front gate would be removed.

Mr. Mulligan is considering recreation ideas for old parking area. The forested area will remain a place to enjoy nature. This new parking lot could serve people wishing to use the Holliday Nature Preserve.

Campsite Reported

HNPA reported a Wayne County Parks. Sadly, HNPA routinely makes these reports. (Camping or staying in the Preserve overnight is and always has been illegal.)

What was discovered at this site was deeply disturbing. Not only was there a great deal of trash, there was a great number of cat food cans. But, instead of cats, this site had rats. Wayne County Parks quickly responded.

Bill led Deputy Parks Director, David Cartwright, and his team to the hard-tofind location. Seeing was believing, so Parks will take immediate action. It is likely a hazardous materials contractor will be required to clean this site.

Grant Work to Begin Soon

A t the time of this writing, the MI Dept. of Environment, Great lakes, and Energy will not be holding a public hearing on the Wayne County Parks permit application for work in the Preserve.

Several changes were made in the application, and many concerns and questions were addressed by the applicant. HNPA was greatly relieved to know that the proposed bridge over Morgan Creek was taken out of application. WC Parks is still in permitting stage. A tentative schedule has work starting in Ellsworth and Cowan in June.

Wayne Road Bridge Work

Contractors are making quick work demolishing the Wayne Road bridge over Tonquish Creek.



This work will disconnect the Preserve for many months. WC Parks is developing plans to re-establish connectivity of the Tonquish Trail, for travel between Ellsworth and Cowan sections of Preserve.

WC Parks Seeking New Director

Wayne County Parks is currently in search of a new Parks Director since the sudden resignation of Alicia Bradford this past winter.

Luckily, Parks has a leadership team in place and so work on the Preserve continues unabated. While we have a good relationship with existing staff and appreciate their support, we look forward to meeting the new director and establishing a good working relationship once that individual is named.
